Given the widespread transmission of SARS-CoV-2, healthcare providers are at an increased risk of contracting the infection and becoming potential carriers of the disease. According to Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), dental health care personnel (DHCP) are placed in very high exposure risk category as dentists work in close proximity to the patient's oral cavity and, dental procedures involve the use of rotary instruments such as handpieces and scalers, which pro-



duce aerosols. A greater understanding of the structure of the virus, modes of transmission, clinical features, and testing methods is needed that can help to form protocols for dental practices to identify cases and prevent further spread of infection to the patients and DHCP. SARS-CoV-2 is the seventh member of virus which is infecting the human beings.
