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Abstract:

All students in high school are allowed to go home and spend much of their time in school. And the amount of hours of reading material or work may not be known to students at home. However through audiovisual interviews, attempted to interview some of the students. Taught that each student should learn to submit online or video recordings. Each district must have policies, such as travel restrictions and quarantine measures that may impact either inbound or outbound students, to track health and safety developments related to COVID19. A detailed coordination plan must be available for the host district to: Ensure successful contact between volunteers, students



and parents, host families, and Rotary. Allow program leaders to quickly locate and communicate with all parties in the event of an emergency.
