So I took my books and lectures with me to chemotheraoy session with 1 hand holding my lecture and the other having the IV. Canula. I used to force myself into the clinical rotations with my doctors back in my school with gloves and masks to try reduce the risk of infections as my immunty was nearly 0.I used to go all the way to irbid from amman which is a 1 hr 30 min ride and back again to KHCC for my chemotherapy session daily for my whole period of treatment. I passed all my exams with grades my colleagues have not reached it even.
